Erin Trish, PhD, is co-director of the USC Schaeffer Center for Health Policy & Economics and an associate professor of pharmaceutical and health economics at the . USC Mann School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences. She is a nonresident fellow in economic studies at the Brookings Institution. Trish's research focuses on the intersection of public policy and health care markets, with recent projects on Medicare Part D, Medicare Advantage, surprise medical bills, health care market concentrations and health care reform. Trish completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the USC Schaeffer Center and the Fielding School of Public Health at UCLA. She earned a PhD in health policy and economics from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and a BS in biomedical engineering from Johns Hopkins University.
