The Regional Hospital Supplier Diversity Initiative

In response to Assembly Bill 962 (Burke), requiring hospitals to annually submit a report to the California Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) on its minority, women, LGBT, and disabled veteran business enterprise procurement efforts, CLC and HASC established a Hospital Supplier Diversity Task Force. The task force helped guild our efforts to support hospitals as they diversify their procurement processes and practices by identifying suppliers that meet diverse classifications.

The initiative is an innovative, scalable, and replicable model for health equity, positioned to lead significant systemic change across the HASC region. Addressing inequities in hospital procurement spend by increasing economic opportunities for small diverse-owned businesses will create job opportunities, increase local revenue, and improve community conditions to support the overall health and wellbeing of the communities served.
