Shola Richards is the CEO and Founder of Go Together Global™ and an authority on civility and workplace happiness. He is the best-selling author of Making Work Work and Go Together, and his articles and "Go Together Movement" email series have been read by fans in over 160 countries. His work has been featured on the Today Show and CBS This Morning, and in Forbes and Black Enterprise, among many international outlets. As a speaker, Shola has shared his transformative message with top universities, health care organizations, Silicon Valley, the motion picture industry, TEDx audiences and the U.S.

House of Representatives, offering expert recommendations on bringing more civility to Congress. Not least, Shola is a father, husband, identical twin and self-professed "kindness extremist" who will not rest until bullying and incivility is extinct from the American workplace.







Innovation at the Speed of Trust

Thom Mayer, MD, FACEP, FAAP, FACHE, is Medical Director for the NFL Players Association, Executive Vice President of Leadership for LogixHealth, and Clinical Professor of Emergency Medicine at George Washington University, among many roles. The originator of the entire NFL Concussion Guidelines program, Dr. Mayer has changed the nature of concussion diagnosis and management worldwide. He was recently nominated to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio, and named one of the "100 Most"

Important People in the NFL" by USA Today. A member of three Defense Science Board Task Forces, advising the Secretary of Defense, Dr. Mayer served as the Command Physicians at the Pentagon Rescue Operation on 9/11/2001. In 2022, he helped lead a mobile team to Ukraine. A prolific and award-winning author, Dr. Mayer is one of the most widely sought speakers on patient experience, health care leadership, trauma and emergency care, and sports medicine.

A Prescription for Co-creating Health Care with Our Patients

Vice Admiral Raquel C. Bono, MD, MBA, FACS, is a board-certified trauma surgeon who served nearly 30 years with honor as a highly respected naval officer and the military's first female surgeon to hold the rank of vice admiral (three star). As the former CEO and Director, Defense Health Agency, Dr. Bono led a joint agency that enabled the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force medical services to provide health care to combatant commands. She integrated a \$50 billion worldwide enterprise with 50 hospitals and 300 clinics providing care to 9.5 million military beneficiaries; oversaw the Department of Defense's electronic health record system deployment; and advanced development of the largest federated health system with the Department of Veterans Affairs. The first Asian American woman promoted to vice admiral, Dr. Bono is an inspiration for all surgeons, especially women and those in the military.





Applying Design Thinking to Health Care's Most Pressing Challenges

(Three ACHE Face-to-Face credits awarded) **Leslie Wainwright, PhD**, is Chief Funding and Innovation Officer, Parkland Center for Clinical Innovations, Dallas. Her experience includes academic research, pharma/biotechnology and health care delivery; working with startups and multinational executive teams in creating growth strategies and alternative business models; and evaluating emerging clinical technologies. Prior to joining Parkland, Dr. Wainwright oversaw RTI International's Innovation Advisors health practice, guiding the development and adoption of health care innovation. She has held executive roles with Sg2, AVIA and Business Models Inc. Dr. Wainwright earned her doctorate in microbiology at Northwestern University and completed postdoctoral training at the University of Maryland's Center for Vaccine Development.

Statewide Advocacy Update

Since 2017, Carmela Coyle has served as President and CEO of the California Hospital Association (CHA), the lead advocate for the state's 400-plus hospitals and health systems with the state and federal government. Previously, Carmela led the Maryland Hospital Association for nine years, overseeing the shaping of a statewide, value-driven health care system. She also spent 20 years with the American Hospital Association, including 11 as Senior Vice President of Policy. Earlier, at the U.S. Congressional Budget Office, Carmela advised members of Congress on the economic and budgetary implications of legislative policy. Along with her CHA role, Carmela serves on numerous boards of organizations working to protect and improve various aspects of health care.


